

In the last year we expanded our water programs, adding nine new communities to our list of partners, and engaged over 70,000 people from Fort Collins to Castle Rock, from Greeley to Aspen and in between. We expanded our school energy program, Renew Our Schools, to help schools across the nation reduce carbon emissions. We're also planning big improvements to make our Materials Reuse program achieve even more waste diversion and serve as a national zero waste model that our community can take pride in.
