Keep your yard buzzing all year long with the Native Nectar garden! This pollinator-friendly collection of native plants will entice butterflies, bees, and birds to feast all season long. This garden offers a variety of unique xeric perennials, like Rose Milkweed, Lewis Flax, and Yellow Prairie Coneflower. Bees will dive into the cheerful and brilliant display of the tall Maximilian Sunflower, and butterflies will dance atop the Showy Fleabane.

### Individual Plant Information

BIG BLUESTEM GRASS - Andropogon gerardii



In early spring, the stems of this native grass are a beautiful blue-green, turning to coppery red tones in the summer.

CARE: This highly adaptable warm-season grass is easily grown in conditions that range from dry, well-drained soils to shady, fertile soils. However, if placed in highly fertilized, wet areas, the grass can become top heavy and fall over. Can be slow to establish.

BLUE FLAX - Linum lewisii

Saucer-like, sky blue flowers on wiry stems rise from an airy clump of linear, dark bluish-green foliage.

CARE: Thrives in open areas along ridges and dry slopes making it an ideal candidate for dry, open, sunny locations. It performs best in well-draining soils. Mulch with gravel or not at all. Since this plant has an extensive taproot it does not like to be transplanted or divided once established.

MAXIMILIAN SUNFLOWER - Helianthus maximiliani

This warm-season native has tall, leafy, and unbranched stems that are adorned with charming and numerous 5-inch yellow flowers from late summer to first frost.

**CARE:** It performs best in sunny locations and will not tolerate shade. Be sure not to overwater as this plant can become aggressive! To control the height and spread, keep watering to a minimum once established.



A flowering member of the mint family, its signature fountain-shaped blooms and aromatic foliage are reminiscent of mint and orange making it hard to forget.

**CARE:** In general, this hardy perennial thrives best in moist-to-slightly dry soils in sunny, dry locations. If you'd like a bushier plant then cut back stem tips early in the season.

#### NATIVE BLANKET FLOWER - Gaillardia aristata





The Native Blanket Flower boasts large daisies with reddishbrown centers circled by ray flowers of yellowbronze.

**CARE:** Blanket Flowers appreciate a bit of pampering the first season, and then take off on their own. Avoid planting in rich, moist soils, which can make the plants floppy and shorten their life span. Once established it is very lowmaintenance, adaptable, and easy to grow.

#### PRAIRIE YELLOW CONEFLOWER - Ratibida columnifera





Its linear, bright green leaves create an airy clump with several slender stalks capped by yellow flowers with drooping rays surrounding a tall, brown center.

**CARE:** Prairie Coneflower is very drought tolerant and undiscerning about soil types. It thrives in full, hot sun.

#### ROCKY MOUNTAIN PENSTEMON - Penstemon strictus





The brilliant, midnight blue flowers form on stout stalks arising from narrow, glossy green leaves. This semievergreen variety is native to the Rockies.

**CARE:** Penstemon varieties prefer not to be overcrowded and prefer maximum heat and sun exposure. Avoid enriching the soil around these finicky plants — it will shorten their life span. This semi-evergreen can be slow to establish, so be sure to weed around it regularly to improve establishment.

#### ROSE MILKWEED - Asclepias incarnata

Stiff green stems with opposite, linear to ovate thick leaves are topped with umbels of pink, crown-like flowers throughout the summer.

**CARE:** Plants have deep taproots and are best left undisturbed once established. Grows well in well-draining soil as well as more damp soils.

#### SHOWY FLEABANE - Erigeron speciosus

QTY. 1



A thick clump of rich green foliage producing loosely branched stems with yellow-centered daisies surrounded by lavender-blue rays.

**CARE:** This hardy perennial is undemanding and easy to grow.

Switchgrass forms elegantly tall, dense stands of green changing to deep red throughout the summer and ending the season as a burgundy wine color in the fall.

**CARE:** Extremely drought tolerant and grows well in any type of soil.

Tall, green to bluish-green leafy stems form clumps that turn purple in the fall. Dark yellow to tan flowers are borne at the ends of the stems, above the foliage.


CARE: Indiangrass is a lowmaintenance grass that likes medium to dry soil in full sun.



## Plant Maintenance by Season

1AINTENANCE TASKS	PLANT
SPRING (AFTER FIRST GROWING SEASON)	
Cut back old growth before new growth begins to show.	Big Bluestem Grass, Blue Flax, Maximilian Sunflower, Prairie Yellow Coneflower, Rocky Mountain Penstemon, Switchgrass, Yellow Indiangrass
Divide mature plants in early spring every 3 years, as needed.	Native Blanket Flower, Native Bee Balm, Prairie Yellow Coneflower, Showy Fleabane, Switchgrass, Yellow Indiangrass
SUMMER	
Deadhead spent flowers to encourage new blooms and/or minimize self-seeding.	Native Blanket Flower, Native Bee Balm, Prairie Yellow Coneflower, Rose Milkweed, Showy Fleabane
Pinch back tips by $1$ inch to promote busy appearance and more blooms.	Maximilian Sunflower
FALL	
Leave last round of blooms to self-seed and/or to provide food for birds.	Blue Flax, Maximilian Sunflower, Prairie Yellow Coneflower, Rocky Mountain Penstemon
Deadhead to prevent self-seeding and spreading, if desired.	Native Blanket Flower, Native Bee Balm, Rose Milkweed, Showy Fleabane
