Looking to fill a few empty spots in your low-water garden? The purple hues of these six perennials will be a perfect cool-toned compliment to your space.

-  Full sun exposure (requires a minimum of 6 hrs of direct sun per day)
-  Blooms summer to fall
-  Low water needs
-  Hardiness maximum of 6,500 ft.

BLUE PINCUSHION - *Scabiosa columbaria* 'Butterfly Blue'

These blooms display cheerful, lavender-blue florets which surround a light gray center with fine hairs resembling pins, hence the common name "Blue Pincushion".

-  Mature height 18-24"
Mature spread 18-24"
-  Full sun
-  Low water needs
-  Blooms mid to late summer
-  Attracts butterflies
-  Resists deer



CARE: Best grown in well-drained soils, this plant is intolerant of water-logged and heavy clay soil.

MAY NIGHT SALVIA - *Salvia nemorosa* 'May Night'

A dense, upright clump with erect stalks rising from grayish-green, oblong leaves to present crowded spikes of violet-blue flowers from early to late summer.

-  Mature height 18-24"
Mature spread 12-18"
-  Full sun
-  Low water needs
-  Blooms summer
-  Attracts bees, birds, butterflies
-  Resists deer, rabbits



CARE: This hardy plant is not fussy about soil and flourishes in full sun and low amounts of water.

PURPLE CONEFLOWER - *Echinacea purpurea* **N**

QTY. 2



Large, upswep, daisy-like purple flowers with showy, rose-colored rays above sturdy yet thin green stalks.

-  Mature height 2-3'
Mature spread 18-24"
-  Full sun
-  Low water needs
-  Blooms summer to fall
-  Attracts bees, birds, butterflies



CARE: Avoid planting this variety near other varieties of coneflowers to prevent overcrowding. Division is not recommended due to long tap root.

Plant Maintenance by Season

MAINTENANCE TASKS

PLANT

SPRING (AFTER FIRST GROWING SEASON)

Divide mature plants, in early spring every 3-4 years, as desired.

Blue Pincushion, May Night Salvia

Cut back old growth or winter damage in mid to late spring.

Blue Pincushion, May Night Salvia, Purple Coneflower

SUMMER

Deadhead spent flowers to encourage new blooms and compact growth, and/or to minimize self seeding.

FALL

Leave last blooms to self-seed and/or feed the birds come winter.
