Brighten up the slope with these perennials, organized in the planting maps provided by water needs, with the true drought tolerant plants up at the top of the slope and those with more adaptable needs towards the bottom.

ANGELINA SEDUM - Sedum rupestre 'Angelina'



Trailing mats of succulent, chartreuse, needle-like foliage form a low groundcover. The tips of the foliage often have a dark amber color.

CARE: Water regularly for the first season to establish the root system. Make sure the soil is well-drained, as Hyssops do not tolerate soil that is constantly wet. After it is established, it is very drought tolerant.



Bold spikes of sunset orange flowers, which have a wonderful root beer aroma, are borne from August to frost. Native to the American Southwest, it climate in sun or partial shade.

This strongly aromatic plant is covered in miniscule hairs giving it a soft, grey-green appearance. It will grow into a shiny pillow that remains all winter long.

MISSOURI EVENING PRIMROSE - Oenothera macrocarpa N

Native to the High Plains this perennial has large, square lemon-yellow flowers. Although the flowers are only open for one evening, the plant will bloom again and again throughout the season.

CARE: The Missouri Evening Primrose fares well in hot, dry areas with well-drained soil, and once established, it will become droughttolerant. Prevent complete soil dryness, and maintain a mulch layer.

penstemon features tubular, scarlet-orange flowers with yellow throats. The prolific blooms rest atop soft, green, needle-like foliage, covering the plant throughout the midsummer months.





Plant Maintenance by Season

MAINTENANCE TASKS	PLANT
SPRING (AFTER FIRST GROWING SEASON)	
Divide mature plants in early spring every 3-4 years, as desired.	Fringed Sage, Pineleaf Penstemon, Serbian Yarrow
Cut back old growth or winter damage in mid to late spring.	Blaze Little Bluestem Grass, Coronado Hyssop, Missouri Evening Primrose, Pineleaf Penstemon, Rocky Mountain Penstemon, Serbian Yarrow
If weather in the spring is rainy, place a plastic gallon milk jug with the bottom cut out over the plant to keep the ground around the plant dry. Leave the top off of the jug so the plants don't overheat in the sun.	Angelina Sedum, Raspberry Ice Plant
SUMMER	
Deadhead spent flowers to encourage new blooms and compact growth and/or minimize self-seeding.	Fringed Sage, Missouri Evening Primrose, Serbian Yarrow
Water sparingly once established.	Angelina Sedum, Coronado Hyssop, Pineleaf Penstemon, Rocky Mountain Penstemon, Raspberry Ice Plant
FALL	
Leave last round of blooms to self-seed and/or to provide food for birds.	Blaze Little Bluestem Grass, Missouri Evening Primrose, Rocky Mountain Penstemon, Serbian Yarrow
Do not prune or cut back! Wait until spring to cut back to avoid crown rot.	Coronado Hyssop, Fringed Sage




