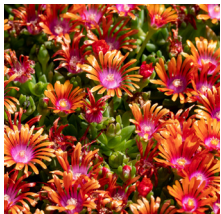

1. FIRE SPINNER® ICE PLANT - *Delosperma* 'P001S'

 Mature height 1-2"
Mature spread 10-12"




 Blooms summer to fall

ADDITIONAL INFO: This succulent thrives in poor quality, well-drained, sandy or gravel soils. Do not add compost to the soil around this plant. Mulch with gravel or not at all. It is important to water consistently during the first growing season in order to establish an extensive root system.


2. PINELEAF PENSTEMON - *Penstemon pinifolius*

 Mature height 6-8"
Mature spread 12-15"

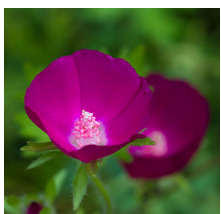



 Blooms midsummer

ADDITIONAL INFO: This penstemon variety prefer not to be overcrowded, and does best with maximum heat and sun exposure. Avoid enriching the soil around these finicky plants - it will shorten their lifespan. This semi-evergreen plant can be slow to establish, so be sure to weed around it regularly.

3. PRAIRIE WINECUP - *Callirhoe involucrata*

 Mature height 8-12"
Mature spread 2-3'



 Blooms early summer to fall

ADDITIONAL INFO: This perennial grows well in dry rocky areas like prairies, pastures, open woods, and roadsides. Winecups are incredibly drought-resistant, with foliage that will stay green nearly all year. Due to its long taproot, transplanting/division is not recommended.

Plant Maintenance by Season

MAINTENANCE TASKS	PLANT
SPRING (After first growing season)	
Cut back old growth or winter damage in mid to late spring.	Pineleaf Penstemon, Prairie Winecups
Divide mature plants in early spring every 3-4 years, as needed.	Pineleaf Penstemon
If spring weather is rainy, place a gallon milk jug with the bottom cut out over the plant to keep the ground around it dry. Leave the top off the jug so the plants don't overheat in the sun.	Fire Spinner® Ice Plant
SUMMER	
Deadhead spent flowers to encourage new blooms and compact growth, or to minimize self-seeding.	Prairie Winecups
Water sparingly once established.	Fire Spinner® Ice Plant
