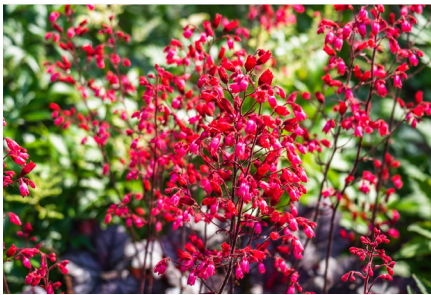





# Nine Pack: Part Shade

## Individual Plant Information

### 1. PLUMBAGO - *Ceratostigma plumbaginoides*

QTY. 3



Mature height 8-12"  
Mature spread 18-24"



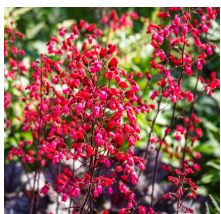
**ADDITIONAL INFO:** When this plant goes dormant for the winter, it often vanishes from sight. It is also late to emerge in the spring, so be sure to mark its spot in the garden to avoid accidental damage. Does not tolerate poorly drained soils.

### 2. RED CORAL BELLS - *Heuchera* 'Bressingham Hybrid'

Mature height 18-24"  
Mature spread 18-24"



**ADDITIONAL INFO:** This relatively low maintenance plant appreciates well drained soil and shade. Also appreciates a layer of winter mulch.

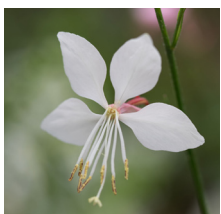


Blooms late spring to

### 3. WHIRLING BUTTERFLIES - *Gaura lindheimeri*

QTY. 3



Mature height 2-3'  
Mature spread 18-24"



**ADDITIONAL INFO:** An extremely low-maintenance plant! Division is not recommended due to its deep tap root. Prefers well drained soils, so add a bit of compost to its planting hole if your soil is clay-heavy.

## Plant Maintenance by Season

MAINTENANCE TASKS	PLANT
SPRING (After first growing season)	
Cut back old growth or winter damage in mid to late spring.	Plumbago, Whirling Butterflies
Divide mature plants in early spring every 3-4 years, as needed.	Plumbago, Red Coral Bells
SUMMER	
Deadhead spent flowers to encourage new blooms and compact growth, or to minimize self-seeding.	Whirling Butterflies
FALL	
Leave last round of blooms to self-seed and/or to provide food for birds.	Red Coral Bells, Whirling Butterflies
Do not prune or cutback! Plant susceptible to winter damage if pruned.	Plumbago
